Collect

Almighty God, who alone can bring order to the unruly wills and passions of sinful humanity: give your people grace so to love what you command and to desire what you promise, that, among the many changes of this world, our hearts may surely there be fixed where true joys are to be found; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. or Eternal God, whose Son went among the crowds and brought healing with his touch: help us to show his love, in your Church as we gather together, and by our lives as they are transformed into the image of Christ our Lord.

Reading Jeremiah 17.5-10

Thus says the Lord: Cursed are those who trust in mere mortals and make mere flesh their strength, whose hearts turn away from the Lord. They shall be like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see when relief comes. They shall live in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land.

Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit.

The heart is devious above all else; it is perverse—who can understand it? I the Lord test the mind and search the heart, to give to all according to their ways, according to the fruit of their doings.

Gospel Luke 6.17-26

He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them.

Then he looked up at his disciples and said: 'Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. 'Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. 'Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. 'Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets. 'But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. 'Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. 'Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. 'Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

Saving Energy - Saving Money!

I thought I should explain why the Church was rather cold last Sunday (9th February). As you probably know the Church is heated by a gas boiler system. All historic Grade II listed Churches like ours are draughty, poorly insulated and challenging to heat. We also have a Diocesan mandate to create and implement a Net-Zero RouteMap.

As part of our plan to reduce energy cost and carbon footprint we have recently been working on improving energy use efficiency. Fortunately, the reordering of the Church in 2010 included two new boilers and quite a smart controls system. You might find some numbers help provide important context. We have 110kW of boiler power, and I have measured the cost of heating for the two services on the Sunday before last to be around £50 and 150 kg of CO_2 . The current annual gas bill for the Church alone is £6800, and it's not unusual for the bills for each of the four winter months being between £800 and £1000 per month. I have been experimenting with revised temperatures and heat-up time control. We are targeting a 50% reduction in energy use for services. Please bear with us while we finesse this. Thank you!


